



THE O.H. HUTCHINGS STATION POWER PLANT

The Mound Science and Energy Museum (MSEM) is pleased to announce that Dayton Power & Light's Mark S. Sizemore, and a former Mound Employee, will discuss the history and future of the O.H. Hutchings Station Power Plant, as part of MSEM's continuing WEDNESDAY NIGHT PRESENTATIONS, on Sept. 24, 2014.

The historic plant which is located just south of the Mound Business Park on the Great Miami River, was a coal-fired power station which has now been shut down and is being prepared for demolition. Mr. Sizemore was plant manager at this generating station after leaving the Mound.

Mark S. Sizemore is currently the Plant Manager for Dayton Power & Light's fleet of peaking units in Indiana and Ohio, two solar facilities and a battery storage facility in Moraine. In 2013 Sizemore was the project construction manager overseeing the installation of the first battery storage facility in Ohio. He has also served as senior operations manager and maintenance manager for DP&L since joining the company in 2000. Before starting at DP&L, Sizemore was in managerial roles at Leland Aerospace Service Center in Vandalia, Hobart Brothers Co., in Troy and EG&G Mound Applied Technologies in Miamisburg. Sizemore has a bachelor's of science degree in electrical engineering from Ohio University.
