He served 25 years on the Dayton Police Department as Commander of the Violent Crime Bureau. In 1982 Dan began working as a consultant to the Mound Laboratory Security Dept. In 1989, after retiring from the Dayton Police Dept. he became the head of Security at Mound Laboratory, staying in that position until 1995. He then transferred to the Hanford, Washington site, returning to Mound in 1999 where he remained until 2004.
