Summary: Please join us as we review the history of the Runnymede estate, which began with the Dayton lawyer George W. Houk and his wife, the writer Eliza Phillips Thruston Houk. We'll review the lives of the Houks and their family, including the noted singer and philanthropist Katharine Houk Talbott and her husband, the engineer and industrialist Harold E. Talbott. We'll also trace the history of Katharine's "Runnymede Playhouse," which served as a social and entertainment center from its completion in 1927 until its conversion in 1944 into a top-secret lab that served a crucial role in the Dayton Project during development and use of the atomic bombs in World War II.
